Despite no news on the guidance, it's good to know that Epping's Tutor Hannah and HEP Laura were able to get back to some sort of normality by delivering in person teaching to St Mary's school Beckenham, who have been missing out on their weekly lessons in the park until now.

New Eco Skills Team

The permanent team for Eco-Skills is now in place, picking up from the fantastic development work undertaken by the interim team over the past few months. The Eco-Skills team will organise 150-200 Eco-Skills courses to run online from April and at FSC Centres and other venues from July. This includes around 90 previously successful courses that we're looking to run again at FSC Centres and other places, alongside a large number of new courses from our new learning frameworks to be delivered both online and place-based. The courses are for people aged 18+ across the UK, plus some targeted provision for people aged 16-17, including Young Darwin. They will be delivered in the main by associate tutors and we are currently in the process of booking the tutors and venues although customers themselves will book the courses directly through the website. New Scientist Article Success

In January I wrote that the New Scientist Magazine offered free pages to charities and that we were successful in pitching an article about what we do. At the time I commented that it may flush out a rich benefactor. So I'm pleased to report that an individual anonymous donor has donated £5K and told FSC that he had money to give away and was flicking though old copies of New Scientist and our article chimed with him, adding that he thought our work with young people will be especially important post pandemic. In addition, the property law firm Kilburn Strode deal with new inventions across a wide variety of scientific areas and they particularly liked the phrase "Studying unpredictable nature develops practical, problem solving skills. Dealing with complex, messy data and adapting to the unexpected are essential to equip learners for the fourth industrial revolution" and have invited FSC to apply for their CSR award worth £30k. From first spotting the opportunity, writing the article and now to following up leads has involved staff and Bebold Media working collaboratively across teams and at speed which has become the hallmark of our response to getting through the last year.

Taxing times

Along with the daffodils comes the end of the tax year so time to remind you about being able to claim tax relief for working from home. It recognises the impacts on heating, lighting and broadband bills. Sadly there isn't yet a scheme to help out those of us whose grown up children moved back in a year ago. The application process has been made as simple as possible which in itself is a sign that we are living in extraordinary times. You can claim for a whole tax year even if you have only worked from home for one day due to Covid-19. It's worth about £60 for basic rate tax payers. complete the online application. If you are eligible you will receive your full entitlement by way of an adjustment to your tax code.
