Living with Covid

The C-OPT team have been working through the implications of the PM's announcement for England, and changes due in Scotland and Wales too. The Health and Safety Working Group met today to iron out more of the details. As restrictions lift, one common thread is that adopting those routine Covid-19 behaviours into our daily routines will become an essential part of how we live with COVID-19.

Last Week's All Staff Zoom

It was a good turnout for last week's all staff zoom. Thank you for making the time and for engaging in the chat and discussions. The recording is <u>here</u> for those of you that missed it, or would like a recap of what was discussed. I shared the proposed organisational goals for 2022 and also a dashboard that we will be using to measure our progress towards those goals. After final sign off by the Board of Trustees we will provide an easier to read version. The meeting flagged up that some staff don't know how to order FSC publications for the centre shops. Price Rises

I'm sure it will come as no surprise to either staff or our customers that the price of our courses will have to increase. The SLT have agreed a price rise of 6% for 2023 in order to ensure that we cover our costs. The nature of what we offer at centres means that FSC is disproportionately impacted by price rises in food, heating fuel and the need to recruit and retain enough staff. We are working on some extra messaging around this for centre and sales staff in case any of our customers want to know more.

FSC Apprenticeships

The recent National Apprenticeships Week saw one of FSC's own past apprentices take to the airwaves. Customer Relations Advisor Jess Horne, who started an apprenticeship with us when aged just 15, spoke to Radio Shropshire about what FSC has to offer. You can <u>hear her via this link 2hrs</u> <u>52min into the show</u> Jess admitted to feeling nervous but there's no sign of it. We are starting to see apprentices move into permanent posts, for example in Hospitality and Catering via the Government's Kick Start Scheme. We have also welcomed back one former apprentice who rejoined FSC's marketing team on a permanent basis.

Back in September we welcomed a cohort of 10 Trainee Tutors to do a Level 3 Outdoor Activity Instructor Apprenticeship. I'm pleased to say that the plan to grow our own pool of talent is paying off as four have already been promoted to Tutor, and a further two have Tutor roles from March. Six months in, I asked them to reflect on their experiences so far:

Cam Jaramillo, now a Tutor at Margam wrote that "Being offered the trainee tutor apprenticeship with Field Studies Council was a big turning point in my career path. After graduating university, and over a year of fruitlessly applying for jobs in the environmental sector, I finally had my foot in the

door. I hadn't really considered education or teaching before this opportunity, but here I am 6 months later in a role as a full time tutor and excited for new prospects.

Emma Kendall, Tutor at Slapton wrote that "The apprenticeship has been a great opportunity for me develop my skills and confidence in teaching, explore new areas of the UK, while meeting amazing, like-minded people along the way. After two and a half years in the PR industry, I've loved being able to work outside using my geographical knowledge gained at university. I've thoroughly enjoyed my first month and a half at Slapton Ley as a permanent tutor and look forward to learning more in the future ... and enjoying the summer months by the sea."
