Spotlight on the Publications Unit

With a number of new staff possibly being unaware of it, it's a good opportunity to highlight the work of our Publications Unit who operate from a dedicated warehouse in Telford. The unit publishes identification charts, wildlife gifts and books. For many people, the fold-out charts are what FSC is known for. Wildlife presenter Chris Packham apparently has a full set in the boot of his car. Our publications are one way in which we can extend our reach and impact beyond our centres. This was amply demonstrated during the pandemic when sales rocketed even when centres were closed.

Publication Discounts for Centres

All FSC Centres can order substantially discounted publications to sell to guests and in centre shops. You can browse the 200+ titles available at <u>the shop</u>, although please don't place centre orders online, as you won't be able to get the internal discount that way. Instead just e-mail <u>publications@field-studies-council.org</u> or phone 01952 208910, and let them know the titles and quantities you need.

Centres are eligible for 45% discount on the usual price for fold-out guides, 45% discount on wildlife gifts, 33% discount on AIDGAP books and 30% discount on Royal Entomological Society Handbooks. The unit cannot take orders by sale or return, but since there is no minimum order quantity you do not need to commit to large amounts of stock. Please allow a week for delivery.

This summer, publications are also trialling several point-of-sale options, including spinners and counter-top displays. A number of centre shops are already taking part in the trial, but the team are always interested in extending this to others. Please let publications know if you want to be involved.

Bishops Wood Open Day

Congratulations and thank you to Vicki, her staff and others from across the charity who delivered a much appreciated event. After the restrictions of Covid the event also allowed Bishop's Wood to connect and reconnect with local people, some of whom have now been signed up to the growing team of 30 volunteers. Visitors said they would be back and would recommend us without hesitation. Bishops Wood MP is visiting next week. One particularly touching comment was "may your organisation continue to flourish in these strange times where being outside has much to commend it."
