"State Funded Curriculum Resources"

The Department for Education's announcement that the Oak Academy would become an arms length body providing free curriculum resources raised eyebrows. The academy became well known for providing materials during lockdown. They were not the only ones, including ourselves with our really popular #Fieldworklive and #PrimaryNatureLive offers. Since then we have developed our Digital Hub. Why Oak has been appointed is a bit of a mystery.

Questions have been asked in the House about the impact on of what amounts to state funded curriculum resources, thus undermining what we and others offer. The not particularly detailed response is that the business case will be published shortly. Another major academy chain has already taken it's ball away and set up a rival so I suspect this might not be the end of it.
