Customer Feedback Summary

Last year, as part of a change in our Quality Assurance system we replaced centre feedback sheets with an online survey. We ask our customers to rate us on key aspects of their stay and whether their experience met, exceeded, or fell below their expectations. One of the standout results was the score for FSC staff being helpful and friendly. Over 80% of respondents said you had exceeded expectations. This was despite a particularly difficult year with very stretched staff, so this score is greatly to your credit.

The overwhelming majority of respondents were happy with their visit. Over 90% said that their expectations were met in almost all categories. There are areas to work on as you would expect, and our difficulties in recruiting Hospitality and Catering staff are well known to you – but we have more initiatives in place to help tackle those in the coming year. Over 92.43% of respondents are either 'likely' or 'very likely' to use FSC again which bodes really well for our customer retention.

Our 'Net Promotor Score' (something that I hope most of you will be familiar with from the Staff Pulse Surveys), is very strong. Asked how likely they are to recommend on a scale of 0-10, our customers gave us a score of 63 which is towards the top end of 'great'.
