To add a more personal touch to Mental Health Awareness week, I asked Travelling Tutor Rosie Molton, who also posts on our #wellbeing slack channel, to tell us how she became a Mental Health First Aider:

'My interest started with my own mental health difficulties, and I didn't want people to feel as isolated as I had. So, in lockdown, when I had more time I completed a free training course to gain more awareness of different Mental Health conditions. Similar training is available here. I decided to then train as a Mental Health First Aider, as it means that I have the support from MHFAEngland as part of the MHFAider© network.

It gave me access to more tools, resources, and information to help me have conversations about mental health and guidance about how to support and signpost people to further help and information. They have also recently released a recognised Level 3 qualification that sits alongside the "First Aid" training.
