Staff Reps Needed

One of the ways in which we are transparent about decision making in this charity is our system of <u>Staff Reps</u> on every committee. Those who do the role have many good reasons why. These range from simply being curious about what goes on, wanting to understand the larger picture and how the jigsaw fits together, why certain information is needed and why certain decisions are made. Reps also felt that being able to speak on behalf of staff and linking the strategic to day to day activities was really valuable, as was meeting trustees.

There are two reps for each committee so that the work can be shared. The role involves reading the committee papers in advance, attending the meeting, sharing any staff concerns that have been brought to your attention and being a point of contact if any member of staff has questions arising from the minutes. We currently need two reps for the Board of Trustees in time for the meeting on 5th October and one for Audit and Risk Management for 2nd November. So as soon as you think you might need help with press and media work, please contact the team so that it can be programmed in, no matter how far in advance.
