Dormant Assets Scheme

I've mentioned the Dormant Assets Scheme in previous catch ups. It's expected to release £350 million for England over the next few years from dormant bank accounts. After a public consultation, one of the four main causes to be supported will be a focus on meeting the needs of young people. The government has <u>just announced</u> that the funding will be equally split between those four causes. That means a potential £87.5 million for young people's services, facilities and opportunities. We will be keeping a close eye on any emerging funding possibilities, along with our partners.

Green skills in employment and education

'Green skills' is an oft-used phrase but research has found that public understanding of green skills is low and that different industries have different standards and certification systems which are not always compatible. A broad definition is that "green skills are the capabilities required in role tackling environment challenges" so it's an area of key interest for this charity. The Independent Parliamentary Office of Science and Technology (POST) has therefore started a <u>research project</u> into this area, it's challenges, opportunities and where the skills gaps are that need to be filled. This should help inform our offers to customers.
