Bioblitz

The tutors at Margam took part in this year's Home River Bioblitz. The Home River Bioblitz - a global citizen science endeavour to document the animals, plants and fungi living in and around rivers. It is a collaboration among citizens to show the importance of free-flowing rivers as hosts of much of the world's biodiversity. This is the fourth year the worldwide event will take place with participation in over 70 locations across six continents. The weekend-long, community-driven event encourages people to connect to and explore their local river environments and zoom in on wildlife they may otherwise pass by. The logged iNaturalist observations of the local species will add to an overall understanding of riverine ecology around the world, generating valuable data for science and conservation.

A **bioblitz** is an event where groups of scientists, naturalists, river enthusiasts and volunteers of all ages gather to conduct a field study of biodiversity over a short time within a designated area and document it using iNaturalist. The Home River Bioblitz focuses on rivers and streams as freshwater ecosystems are the most threatened in the world. Next year Margam aims to organise a much larger effort from the charity bringing in as many centres as possible and inviting members of the public.
