We are a 'Member Organisation' of the RSB and as such we work with them in a number of areas from joint events to policy work around the Biology Curriculum.

Half Year Review of Customer Feedback

We have a charity-wide customer review system and this year has seen an increase in the number of reviews received. The data allows us to monitor our performance for the whole of our customers' experience with us by tracking 15 different indicators. We can then respond, make changes or seek to invest as necessary.

I'm really pleased to say that our scores have remained high. When it comes to meeting or exceeding expectations, 12 out of the 15 indicators are over 90%. Value for money indicators remain high and our food quality score has increased significantly in a short time and now 89.2% of customers state that we met or exceeded expectations.

Our customer Net Promotor Score (NPS), which is where we ask customers if they would recommend us has risen slightly to 52 points which puts us firmly in the "Great" bracket. This is the category above "Good" and below "Excellent" but excellent is what we are aiming for. Behind all these results is a lot of hard work and also a willingness to engage with the issues that come to light. You can see the full set of results in the recently circulated papers for the Education Strategy Committee who met yesterday to discuss them. The committee wanted to congratulate staff on these results. Well done.
