Calling all Welsh Residents

Last week saw the introduction of the Outdoor Education (Wales) Bill to the Senedd which aims to guarantee a residential for every Welsh child. We have been working with Sam Rowland's team and local politicians for some time. More support will be needed to have any chance of getting the bill through which would be a huge boost for our Welsh Centre business. The bill got to this stage by just one vote.

For any staff or trustees who live in Wales, or if you have supportive relations or friends, please consider asking the five Members of the Senedd that cover every constituency to either support the bill, or if they are already on board to thank them for their ongoing support.
