Chancellor's Autumn Statement

After the Board of Trustees meeting next Thursday, there will be an email to let you know what has been decided regarding a staff cost of living increase and when any changes would be implemented. However, in order not to overwhelm you with too much financial information in one go, this week we can clarify what will happen as a result of the Chancellor's autumn statement.

If you earn over £242 per week, the rate of National Insurance that you pay will decrease from 12% to 10%, with effect from January 2024. This will result in an immediate increase in your take home pay.

The Chancellor also announced changes to the National Living Wage. With effect from 6th April 2024, it will increase to £11.44. Therefore, Field Studies Council's scale point 4 (we currently don't employ anyone below that scale) will increase from £10.45 per hour to £11.44 per hour. This is an increase of 9.47% on scale point 4. Our normal pay policy of maintaining a minimum 2% differential between pay scales will also be applied in line with this change. These changes will come into effect from April 2024.
