Signs of Spring

Although I'm writing this whilst snow is forecast, we want to maintain the momentum of the <u>Signs of Spring project</u> after such a great start. In just one month we reached approximately 10 million people including via The One Show, which attracts an average 1.3 million viewers and Morning Live, which draws up to 1.4 million. There were another 36 separate pieces of coverage including several radio stations and national trade publications.

There are 10 specific signs to record including the easy to spot daffodil. We are aiming to get 1,000 recordings for at least one of the signs before the project closes in June. Please take a moment to record your latest sightings.

Successful Sustainability Workshops

Sustainability Manager Sam Thurston has been working his way around centres to deliver face to face staff workshops focussed on environmental sustainability. Over 150 staff took part and Sam would like to pass on his thanks to everyone who got involved.

Sam shared that the passion, creativity and energy staff showed towards meeting our sustainability goals shone through. He found that staff were keen to discuss wide ranging topics from our estates and biodiversity, how we manage our waste and how we heat our buildings.

Radio Training

Senior staff have recently had refresher training on dealing with the media in a major crisis. Some are still recovering. But as you will have noticed from recent catch ups, there are lots of opportunities to successfully engage with the media when there isn't a crisis.

Our work and projects make for great radio and most local stations want to talk to the person who is the closest involved rather than the most senior. The more interviews we do, the more requests we get because the BBC database of contributors is shared across all stations.

We need a larger pool of staff who would be able to say yes to doing an interview. If your team or centre would like to have some media training Joy is happy to deliver it. She's had 20 years of doing media work including tough interviews and has coached others to give it a go. The training is fun,

supportive and makes for a good team building. Unlike media crisis training none of your interviews will be recorded and analysed. The training won't commit you to anything but just knowing what's involved, how it works and what local radio is looking for is also valuable.
