Coming up: our regular Staff Pulse Survey

You will shortly receive the bi-annual Staff Pulse Survey in your inbox from the HR team. The survey is very short and should take less than one minute to complete. It will run from 13th May to midnight on 26th May. I would encourage everyone to take part. New members of staff might like to know that the Pulse Survey is carried out twice a year in May and November. It's in addition to the Investors in People Survey that we carry out in October.

As with any pulse reading, it's a snapshot and allows us to calculate a Net Promotor Score. It's a commonly used way of measuring whether any of us would promote or recommend a product, experience or in our case, a place to work. Our regular pulse surveys allow us to track changes over time. It's deliberately different to the Investors In People survey but taken together the results from both are useful and insightful.

New Expenses Claim Form

Finance have created a new expenses form. The new and improved form is to make it easier for all. Although it is self-explanatory, the new form has dropdown lists for the cost centre, type of expenditure and a cell that will highlight any advice or warnings which is linked to the Employee Staff Handbook. Mileage must be inserted for all transport modes. Click the top right hand 'Viewing' tab and choose 'Open in Desktop App' to fully access it. Then choose the 'Save a Copy' option to save it on your own computer and fill that copy in. This will ensure that you don't share your personal details with colleagues via the master copy.

The mileage must be included to enable us to calculate and report our carbon footprint. For taxi and rail fares, tools such as google maps can be used by entering the postcode for the start and end destination. As a reminder all staff can access the Field Studies Council's Trainline Account. Using this has the following advantages:

- No upfront expense required from staff
- The carbon footprint is calculated automatically
- Simpler processing as the organisation will receive one monthly invoice.
